Introduction:

This case was assigned to me by Captain James Miller, the Internal Affairs Commander. Along with providing me with several documents, Captain Miller explained that City of Phoenix Mayor Phil Gordon had requested the US Justice Department investigate the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office for Civil Rights violations.

Discussion:

I was provided with a letter dated April 4, 2008 from Mayor Gordon to the US Attorney General, where the Mayor writes that the Sheriff has a pattern of conduct that included discrimination, unlawful stops, searches and arrests.

Mayor Gordon writes that a member of his staff was victimized by Sheriff's Deputies when she was stopped for "off-roading" in a restricted area.

A member of my own staff was one of six drivers recently detained by one of the Sheriff's deputies for "off-roading" in a restricted area (as they were completing a U-turn to correct their mistake). The first five drivers were asked to show a drivers' license and released without being cited. My staff member was asked not for her license, but for her Social Security card -and was issued a citation. She was the only Hispanic of the six. The other five were Anglo.

Maricopa County Sheriff's Office Deputy Chief Brian Sands contacted the Mayor's office on April 16, 2008 requesting the identity of person on the Mayor's staff making the allegation so that an investigation could be conducted. Mayor Gordon refused to cooperate with the Sheriff's Office, identify his staff member or provide any information to assist in an Internal Investigation. In an attempt to locate the complainant Mayor Gordon was referring to, a request for public records was made on April 24, 2008. The public records were eventually made available the first week of June 2008. Thousands of emails and other correspondence were examined but nothing was found that was consistent with Mayor Gordon's

complaint to the US Justice Department. No correspondence was found indicating the Mayor had received a complaint from a staff member alleging racial profiling.

On July 16, 2008, Captain Miller contacted Captain Hawthorne of the Trails Division, Captain Rodriquez of Lake Patrol and Captain Hindman of District Two, asking for any complaints they may have received concerning anyone cited while in a restricted "off-road" area. These were the three most likely Divisions for this type of activity.

In a further attempt to identify and locate the complainant, Captain Miller initiated a **Briefing Board** asking all employees to report any type of racial profiling.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF DEPUTY
RACIAL PROFILING INVESTIGATION

The Maricopa County Sheriff's Office is conducting an investigation into allegations of racial profiling by deputies conducting traffic stops related to immigration enforcement. If any employee has information regarding possible racial profiling as a method to develop probable cause for stopping and detaining persons, you are directed to bring this information and your concerns forward.

The Maricopa County Sheriff's Office considers any allegation of employee inappropriate conduct a very serious matter. It is important for our Office to identify deficiencies or demonstrate that allegations made against employees are false. Your cooperation in this investigation is appreciated and expected.

Employees with any information or concerns related to this issue are directed to contact Captain James Miller, Internal Affairs Division, through confidential memorandum or by calling (602) 876-5494.

On July 21, 2008, Captain Rodriquez provided Internal Affairs with an Administrative Investigation dated December 7, 2007. The operator of a black Chevy Silverado, David Rodriquez had been cited for going around a road closed sign and his wife Jessica complained that other drivers had not been cited. Jessica suggested that she and her husband were the only Hispanics and stated David was asked for his social security number. David Rodriquez was cited on December 2, 2007. Sergeant Wes Ellison (now retired) spoke with Jessica Rodriquez on December 7th and called her back on December 8th after speaking to the deputy who issued David the citation. Sergeant Ellison explained why other motorist had not been cited and why David had been asked for his Social Security Number. Jessica actually apologized for throwing out the "racial card."

On July 28, 2008 I contacted the City of Phoenix Personnel Department and, through a Public Information Request, I learned Jessica Rodriquez, the complainant in the Lake Patrol investigation as well as David Rodriquez the person who actually received the citation were both City of Phoenix employees.

I also contacted the North Mesa Justice Court and learned that David Rodriguez pleaded guilty to Failure to Obey a Traffic Control Device (the offense he was cited for) and paid a \$120 fine.

Conclusion:

Reviewing the Lake Patrol inquiry, it seems likely that this is the incident Mayor Gordon referred to in his letter to the US Department of Justice. Close examinations of Sergeant Ellison's actions reveal a thorough investigation and appropriate conclusions, given the information provided by the complainant as well as the deputy who issued the citation.

Re: Request for Civil Rights Investigation of the Maricopa County Sheriff

Dear Mr. Attorney General:

I write to request that you direct the Civil Rights Division and the Federal Bureau of Investigation to initiate an investigation into Maricopa County Sheriff Joe Arpaio for potential civil rights violations. I do not make this request lightly. This request is based on Sheriff Arpaio's pattern and practice of conduct that includes discriminatory harassment, improper stops, searches, and arrests.

I understand these are serious allegations.

As Mayor of the City of Phoenix, I must speak out when the rights of our residents are violated and the safety of our neighborhoods threatened. In order that you may understand the gravity of the situation in our city, I provide you with this background and following examples of Sheriff Arpaio's activities in our city.

Phoenix is the fifth largest city in the nation. We are a diverse community that believes the role of law enforcement should be to pursue crime and protect its residents. Our Police Department is second to none in professionalism and ability to meet this goal. We reside within the boundary of Maricopa County, where Joe Arpaio is the elected Sheriff. State law provides Sheriff Arpaio with concurrent jurisdiction over offenses committed in Phoenix.

Over the past few weeks, Sheriff Arpaio's actions have infringed on the civil rights of our residents. They have put our residents' well-being, and the well-being of law enforcement officers, at risk.

Over Easter weekend, Sheriff Arpaio announced he was going to target a specific Phoenix neighborhood by sending 200 posse members into a one square-mile area for "crime suppression". "We lock up murderers, we lock up everybody. We're here for crime suppression, and we're going to lock up everybody," according to the Sheriff.

But they didn't arrest murderers. Under his orders, they performed only routine traffic stops to check immigration status. According to our State's largest newspaper, *The Arizona Republic*:

"Shortly after 5 p.m., a Sheriff's detective pulled over one sedan for stopping in the middle of the street and for having a broken brake light. After questioning, both men admitted they were in the country illegally and were sent on their way to a processing center to await deportation. By 7:30 p.m., the efforts had netted 13 arrests, including nine people suspected of being in the country illegally and four U.S. residents with outstanding warrants or other legal issues."

All were Hispanic.

In announcing his "roundups" the Sheriff worded his news release in such a way – by naming groups of "bikers" who agree with him and will show up to support him (many with guns and rifles) – that he deliberately sets the stage for shouting matches, confrontations or worse. That's not acceptable behavior for anyone, let alone someone whose job is to help make our community safer.

He repeated the same "crime suppression" program this past weekend, targeting and holding 27 Hispanics he believes might be in this country illegally. Sixteen others who were stopped, according *The Arizona Republic*, were only "guilty of looking Latino". By my math, that means Latinos represented 100% of his stops. But even if it were 75%, that would still be of serious concern for a community that is one-third Latino, not three-fourths.

And just last night, the Sheriff, for the third week in a row, staged another roundup – this time, in the Town of Guadalupe. According to our local ABC affiliate, his posse members were stopping Hispanics on the sidewalks and asking them to produce identification. Guadalupe, by the way, usually ranks at or near the bottom in violent crime. Last month, there was just one violent crime committed in the Town of Guadalupe.

His expansion of these roundups, with no end in sight, has compelled me to write this letter today.

The events of the last three weeks are not aberrations. On February 16, the Sheriff said "I wish that the Phoenix Police Department would arrest everybody, even if they're not sure (of that person's status)". That comment, reflective of others, resulted in widespread community outrage – including a strong rebuke from former Maricopa County Attorney Rick Romley.

Legitimate news media sources have been reporting apparent violations of civil rights statutes for some time now. Again, the *Arizona Republic* reported that on September 26, 2007, one of Sheriff Arpaio's deputies detained Manuel de Jesus Ortega Melendres for eight hours before determining that he was lawfully in the United States. That detention is now the subject of a civil rights lawsuit brought by Mr. Melendres.

A member of my own staff was one of six drivers recently detained by one of the Sheriff's deputies for "off-roading" in a restricted area (as they were completing a U-turn to correct their mistake). The first five drivers were asked to show a drivers' license and released without being cited. My staff member was asked not for her license, but for her Social Security card – and was issued a citation. She was the only Hispanic of the six. The other five were Anglo.

These are but two events out of too many others. I have enclosed, as background, a sampling of news reports and video clips.

I believe that these events represent situations in which a civil rights investigation should be initiated.

I specifically and respectfully ask that you investigate whether Sheriff Arpaio's actions constitute a violation of the following laws:

1) Section 210401 of the Violent Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 (42 U.S.C. § 14141, Police Misconduct Provision). As you know, this provision of federal law makes unlawful the deprivation, by a law enforcement agency, of any rights, privileges, or immunities secured by the Constitution or laws of the United States.

2) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. "No person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance." 42 U.S.C. § 2000d.



3) Section 809(c) of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968. "No person in any State shall on the ground of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex ... be subjected to discrimination ... in connection with any programs or activity funded in whole or in part with funds made available under this chapter." 42 U.S.C. §3789d(c)(1).

4) Such other statutes, including a "Color of Law" (18 U.S.C. § 242) violation, as you deem appropriate in the course of your investigation.

I have publicly spoken out against Sheriff Arpaio's actions. I will continue to do so, and to use my position as Mayor of Phoenix to oppose those who violate the civil rights of others. I, and the residents of Phoenix, now look to you to enforce the laws that ensure those rights. Should you need additional information, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Information recently announced by members of the City of Phoenix Government alleged that racial profiling has occurred by personnel from the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office. Based on this information the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office has initiated an internal investigation. The following information is being collected to further this investigation.

This letter is a request that you, as the Custodian of Records for the City of Phoenix, make available for review certain records. If however, you are not the custodian of records, please forward this request to the appropriate person, and inform me as to the identity of the proper Custodian of Records. This request is made pursuant to Arizona Public Records Laws, A.R.S. 39-121 through 39-121.03. Please make available the following material:

- For the City of Phoenix e-mail account assigned to Phil Gordon for the dates of November 1, 2007 to April 24, 2008, any and all email correspondence, electronic or printed, including, but not limited to, all email contained on the email store server, all email stored locally on a user's computer, and/or all email stored on backup storage media. This includes all emails that have been deleted, but not removed, and all emails that have been archived by the user and/or email store system.
- Any and all email correspondence, electronic or printed, including but not limited to, all email residing on email store system backup media.



On 12-07-2007 I received an e-mail from Chris Lucas reference a complaint on Deputy Matt Ratcliffe. The complainant, Jessica Rodriquez, asked to be contacted at (). Upon contacting Rodriquez; she related that on Sunday 12-02-2007 she and her husband had driven to the Bartlett lake area. She related that they had been four wheeling and had entered Bartlett Lake beyond the Barricaded area. Upon doing so, they were stopped along with several other vehicles for being behind the barricades. Rodriquez related that her husband was driving and was cited for Failure to obey a Traffic Control Device by Deputy M. Ratcliffe. She related that there were two deputies, and the other vehicles did not receive a citation. She related that she pointed this out to Deputy Ratcliffe, who issued a citation anyway, and also asked for a Social Security Number. She further went on to say that they had stopped the other vehicles as they left the area, and related that they were the only ones issued a citation. She also commented that they were also the only ones that were Hispanic.

I explained to Mrs. Rodriquez that it was left up to the discretion of each deputy whether or not he issued a citation, and I was not sure of the circumstances surrounding the incident. I told her that a large percentage of our visitors were Hispanic, and that Deputy Ratcliffe has never displayed any type of racial discrimination. I also explained to her that I could not dismiss a citation, and that she needed to take the matter to court. I told her that I would check into the matter, and call her back.

On 12-07-2007 I spoke with Deputy Ratcliffe about this incident. He related that he and Deputy Multz were stopping people that were traveling around the barricaded roadway. Upon this particular incident, he and Multz had gone after two vehicles, one being the complainant's vehicle, and the other a motorcycle. Multz was ahead of him, and stopped the Motorcycle, and he stopped the complainant's truck. While Multz was stopped with the motorcycle, several other vehicles had come into the area, which Multz stopped and turned around. Ratcliffe related that several of the vehicles were attending to sinking boats at the Marina, and one attending to a broken down motor home, so they were allowed access to the area. Ratcliffe related that Mr. Rodriquez admitted to traveling around the barricades, which also caused several other vehicles to follow. Ratcliffe related that he cited Rodriquez, and asked for his Social Security Number for the Citation Form. He related that he observed them travel back to the barricades, and stop several cars that had left the area. Ratcliffe related that he attempted to explain the reason why they were allowing cars into the area. Ratcliffe related that he had cited several others that day, or turned them over to the Forest Service for citation.

On 12-08-2007 I again contacted Mrs. Rodriguez by telephone. I explained again that it was up to the desecration of each individual deputy whether or not to issue a citation. I sympathized with the fact that they were the only one issued a citation at the time, but explained again that it was up to the deputy. She apologized for throwing out the "Racial Card", but felt they did not deserve a citation. I again explained that they could certainly take the matter to court if they felt they were cited wrongly. Rodriguez kept saying that they were the only ones cited, and that they had pointed this out to deputy Ratcliffe, but he cited them anyway. I explained several times that it was at the deputy's desecration. I further told her that I had looked over Ratcliffe's citations for the day, and did not see any evidence of Racial Profiling. I explained to her that the reason he had obtained her husbands Social Security Number was due to the fact that it was required information on the citation form. I told her that I felt that Ratcliffe had not violated any Policies and Procedures of this office, and that I felt her best option was to take the matter to court. Rodriguez related that she wanted this matter pursued further and wanted to take it higher than myself.

After speaking to Ratcliffe, and Deputy Multz, I feel that Ratcliffe only utilized his desecration in issuing a citation. I do not find any evidence where he has committed any Racial Profiling, or where he has violated any Policies or Procedures. This complaint is second hand from the person's wife that was issued the citation. I feel that Mrs. Rodriguez's complaint is unfounded.

This complaint submitted to Lieutenant Aldorasi for further review and disposition.

On 12/02/07 at approximately 1423 hours while standing in the eastern end of Camp Creek Wash on Bartlett Dam Rd. assisting Tonto 110 with issuing complaints to two ATV/Rhino riders that had entered and were now exiting the restricted area to the north of Camp Creek, I observed a motorcycle and a black pickup truck driving eastbound on Bartlett Dam Rd. which had been posted "Road Closed" just east of MP 1 the Wildcat staging area.

Deputy M. Multz and I went to conduct traffic stops on the two vehicles that had violated the "Road Closed" signs. Due to Deputy Multz being in the lead he activated his emergency lights and the trailing vehicle, the black pick up pulled over approximately in the middle of Camp Creek Wash and he continued to catch up to the motorcycle on the western side of the wash, while I contacted the driver of the pick up.

The black pick up a Chevy Silverado bearing AZ 033YTA was driven by David Rodriguez who was identified via AZ driver's license. He said they were taking the kids down to see the water and had driven around the signs, but if the road had gotten to bad they were going to turn around.

The vehicle was also occupied by a female seated in the front passenger seat and due to the window tint of the vehicle I could not see the number of kids in the rear.

I returned to my vehicle and filled out complaint number A684751 to be issued to David Rodriguez for failure to obey a traffic control device.

Approximately at this time several vehicles made the turn on Bartlett Dam rd. and entered Camp Creek, where Deputy Multz had stopped these vehicles at his location.

Upon returning to the vehicle I asked Mr. Rodriguez for his Social Security Number and a phone number to complete the fill in the blanks on the complaint, and explained the citation and what I was citing him for.

Mr. Rodriguez asked if this would affect his CDL status, when the female started to ask why some vehicles were being allowed to pass without getting a ticket.

I explained to her that there were several boats at the marina that had sustained damage and even sunk do to the weather, and their was also people that had RV's at the lake camping that had to go into town to get supplies to fix their RV to get it running.

Neither Mr. Rodriguez nor the front seat passenger liked this answer and said that this was selective enforcement and that nobody up the road was getting a ticket just being told to turn around.

I attempted to explain to them that I was dealing with them and was not sure what the other deputy was doing with the other vehicle that he had stopped.

Complaint was signed and the traffic stop was concluded.
